

Racing Rules

Approved at the 2016 A.G.M.

1. Club Colours

Club colours are agreed by the Committee after consulting the membership.

2. Club record and trophy claims.

Claims for club records and trophies should be made to the Committee on the club claim form. In the event of a dispute the onus for supplying information to substantiate the claim is to be on the claimant not the club.

3. Individual and team records.

- a. Gold medals will be awarded to the rider holding any records at the end of the season. If more than one rider beats the record during the season then, the rider with the current fastest time becomes the medal winner. These rules also apply to team records, in that the fastest team record of the season claims the medals. Riders may choose to have a plaque rather than a medal if they are prepared to bear the cost.
- b. Claims to establish a club record where none currently exists will be considered by the Committee provided:
 - i the event, distance and category are recognised by the CTT
 - ii The time/distance is better than 120% of the time/distance of the current national competition record for the event and category as listed in the CTT handbook.

4. Club records to place and return.

Stone - Buxton - Stone (18 year and above)

Stone - Newport - Stone (vets, ladies, juniors and juveniles)

- a. Stone Buxton-Stone
Start and finish
The centre line of Christ Church, Radford Street, Stone opposite the police station.
Turn
Around the round about outside Buxton railway station. This is the junction of the A54 and A515.
- b. Stone-Newport-Stone
Start and finish
In line with lamp post C3 opposite Stone Guide Hut, Westbridge Park, Stone on the Walton Stone road.
Turn
Around the second round about on the Newport by-pass which is the junction of the A41 and A518.
- c. A date is fixed each year by the Secretary or Time Trials Secretary for record attempts, a timekeeper and official at the turn will be provided by the Club on that date.
- d. Members wishing to attack the records on their own must arrange their own date in co-operation with the Secretary or Time Trials Secretary and a timekeeper, giving at least two weeks prior notice to the attempt. They must also arrange marshals to cover turns and the main points of the route. Marshals to be responsible people approved by the Committee or Time Trials Secretary.
- e. Stone - Newport - Stone is confined to Junior, Juvenile and Lady riders as defined by the CTT rules or veterans of 40 years of age and over on the day of the event.
- f. Silver medals can be won by:
Juveniles, as defined by the CTT, beating the standard time of 1 hour 32 minutes 00 seconds
Juniors, as defined by the CTT, beating a standard time of 1 hour 27 minutes 00 seconds
Veterans, 40 years of age and over, beating the 30 mile standard time as defined by the VTТА for their age
Seniors beating a standard time of 3 hours 30 minutes 00 seconds for the Stone - Buxton - Stone

- g. The standard medal to be engraved with: the event, name of rider, the year and the time. In the case of veterans in the Stone - Newport - Stone the time is to be the time on standard (the plus).
- h. The Stone - Buxton Trophy is awarded to the senior rider with the fastest time for Stone-Buxton-Stone during the year.
- i. The Junior Stone - Newport Trophy is awarded to the junior (as defined by the CTT) rider with the fastest time for Stone - Newport - Stone during the year.
- j. The Veteran Stone - Newport Trophy is awarded to the veteran with the fastest time on standard for Stone - Newport - Stone during the year. The fastest veteran on actual time shall receive a silver medal.
- k. Gold medals are awarded to any rider breaking the club record for the event and category. Second line "18 years and above" replaces "seniors only". Vets can still go for Stone Buxton.

5. Best All Rounder Trophy and Runners-Up Trophy

Starting in the Year 2002 to be decided by a points system.

Points are awarded for completing events. Additional points are awarded for being the fastest rider or having the fastest time at the end of the season. The points are as per the table below.

The rider at the end of the season with the highest number of points is awarded the Hemmings BAR Trophy.

The rider with the second highest number of points is awarded the BAR Runner Up Trophy. Open events up to and including the last weekend in September are considered counting events.

6. Ladies B.A.R. Shield.

This is decided by the fastest average speed over two 10 mile and one 25 mile time trial over the year.

7. Veterans B.A.R. Trophy.

This is to be contested over 10, 25 and 50 miles on standard, on any course.

8. Club Championship Trophy.

This is to be decided by the fastest average speed over 25, 50 and 100 miles.

9. Handicap Trophy.

Awarded to the rider with the fastest combined time from three 25 mile time trials on handicap.

10. Circuit Trial

- a. The fastest Club member in this event shall receive the Albert Ellerton Trophy.
- b. The fastest rider on handicap in this event shall receive the Tommy Godwin trophy.
- c. The fastest lady club member will receive the Ladies Circuit TT Trophy

- 11. Roll of Honour Trophy**
 This carries the names of persons who have died as club members and who have given service to the Club. It is presented to the rider finishing with the fastest time in all the Club's time trials, whether they are open or club events. Counting events are: Circuit Trial (Three Counties), Memorial 25 and the Marjorie Edge 25. The Roll of Honour is awarded to the rider with the lowest aggregate time from the three events.
- 12. Hill Climb**
 The hill climb is organised each year by the club with a trophy for the fastest senior, a trophy for the fastest junior and for fastest lady. Senior and junior categories are as defined by the CTT.
 The course introduced 2003:
 Start:
 in Oulton Heath near Stone in line with telegraph pole number DP190 approximately 20 metres after the cross roads and 5 metres after the end of the white painted metal fence and 50 metres before the telegraph pole by the post box and drive to the house Hillside.
 Finish:
 in line with the end of the green railings on the right as you climb the hill. This is approximately 12 meters before the centre of the drive to the house "Beechwood" and 20 metres after the telegraph pole with the H plate 75 / 13 and 25 metres after the double gates.
- 13. 5 mile Trophy.**
 To be awarded to the fastest rider in a club 5 mile time trial to be run on the evening of the Tuesday closest to the 21st June. The fastest lady will also receive a trophy.
- 14. Track Championship.**
 Points are awarded 3 for a win, 2 for second and 1 for third in all open and league events. All categories compete on an equal basis. Onus on all riders to give proof of placings.
- 15. Road Race Trophies (Senior, Over 50, Under 50 and Junior)**
 Senior and junior riders (categories are as defined by the B.C.F.) finishing in positions 1 to 12 to receive points in the following manner; 12 for first position down to 1 for twelfth position, three points are also given for finishing in an event, therefore a rider finishing first receives 15 points while a rider finishing twelfth gets 4 points. This points system applies to juniors under 18 years of age and to seniors.
 Races run under the rules of the BCF, TLI and LVRC to count equally.
- 16. Juvenile Salver**
 Presented by Joyce and Harry Bentley and awarded to the best improved rider or most helpful member to the club under sixteen years of age as decided by the Committee.
- 17. The Majorie Edge Trophy**
 Presented to the fastest Stone Wheeler in the Autumn 25 mile time trial.
 Stone Wheeler replaces Club rider.
- 18. First Year Rider Trophy**
 Based on times in two 10s and one 25, any events may count, open to all categories of rider.
- 19. Clubman of the Year**
 For contribution to the club, awarded at the discretion of the Committee.
- 20. Charles Rice Shield**
 Awarded to the fastest Stone Wheelers rider on handicap in the Spring (1939/45 memorial) open 25 mile time trial. The organiser will arrange handicapping of Stone Wheelers riders prior to the event.

- 21. 25 mile trophy**
Awarded to the fastest junior over 25 miles, all events on any course count.
- 22. Tommy Godwin Trophy**
Awarded to the fastest Stone Wheelers rider on handicap in the Circuit Time Trial.
Handicapping to be done by club official(s).
- 23. Helen Smith Touring Trophy**
To be awarded for touring on a points basis.
- 24. Stone Wheelers C.C. Memorial Trophy**
Dedicated to Members who made the supreme sacrifice in the war of 1939-45. Presented by Geoff Goodall.
Awarded to the fastest Stone Wheelers rider in the Spring 25.
- 25. Sam Tomlinson Performance Trophy**
Trophy provided by

- 26. Tean 10 Series.**
Trophy provided by
Awarded to rider with most points in the Tean 10 mile time trial series (or other course if this is not available)
